

**VILLAGE OF GROSSE TETE MINUTES
REGULAR MEETING
May 11, 2017**

The Board of Alderman of the Village of Grosse Tete held their regular meeting at the Town Hall in Grosse Tete May 11, 2017 at 6:00 p.m.

Mayor Michael Chauffe called the meeting to order at 6:03 p.m. Attorney Larry Bossier led the Prayer. The pledge was led by Wally Perrault, a citizen of the community and then the Meeting began.

Present: Mayor Michael Chauffe, Alderman Kyle Booksh, Alderman Marcus Hill, Clerk Pam George, Alderwoman Jeanie David, Fire Chief Michael Hughes and Chief of Police Tommy Dardenne

Absent: Maintenance Supervisor Phillip Faveroth

Minutes: Alderman Marcus Hill made a motion to dispense with the reading and approve the minutes from the April 14, 2017 regular meeting. The motion was seconded by Alderwoman Jeanie David and passed 3 - 0.

Finances: Alderwoman Jeanie David made a motion to approve the financial statements of April 30, 2016 as presented. This motion was seconded by Alderman Clint Seneca and passed 3 - 0.

Mayor's Report:

Attorney Arthur Bagwell – Attorney Arthur Bagwell addressed the Board of Alderman and the Mayor to discuss the options for pursuing the clean up at Louisiana Auto Repair. Mr. Bagwell suggests that the Village of Grosse Tete pursue the clean-up of the property rather than the placing of a fence. A motion was made by Alderwoman Jeanie David and seconded by Alderman Marcus Hill for Mr. Bagwell to proceed with matter. The motion was passed 3 – 0.

Mayor Chauffe stated that:

- An agreement between DOTD and The Village of Grosse Tete for matching funds was signed for the sidewalk project. Mr. Meeks, DOTD Engineer stated the project would go out for bids in May or June 2017.
- Mayor Chauffe signed a letter of commitment for matching funds for the Walking Trail Project.
- Sidney Road repairs have been completed and Sidney Road is open for traffic
- The sewer project on Big Dee and Locust Street is 95% complete

Police Department – Chief Dardenne stated that he is gathering information on purchasing digital speed sign.

Fire Department – Chief Hughes stated that he is working on a bid packet for the concrete at Fire Station #2. He also stated that the hose test has been completed and he will need to replace two of the hoses. They responded to 16 calls in April as well as assisted Port Allen with a big wreck/fire on the interstate.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 6:50 p.m.
