

**VILLAGE OF GROSSE TETE MINUTES**  
**REGULAR MEETING**  
**September 8, 2016**

The Board of Alderman of the Village of Grosse Tete held their regular meeting at the Town Hall in Grosse Tete September 8, 2016 at 6:00 p.m.

Mayor Michael Chauffe called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. The pledge was led by Errik Stephens, a member of the community. Alderman Kyle Booksh led the Prayer.

**Present:** Mayor Michael Chauffe, Alderman Kyle Booksh, Alderman Marcus Hill, Maintenance Supervisor Phillip Faveroth, Clerk Pam George, Assistant Fire Chief Claude Brumfield, Alderwoman Jeanie David, Fire Chief Michael Hughes and Chief of Police Tommy Dardenne

**Absent:** Attorney Larry Bossier

**Patriot Environmental Services**– Approached the Board of Alderman to discuss opening a site to sort and dispose of debris from the flooded areas around the Baton Rouge area. Alderwoman Jeanie David made a motion to not allow Patriot to open a Debris Disposal Site within the Village of Grosse Tete. This motion was seconded by Alderman Kyle Booksh and passed 3 – 0.

**Minutes:** Alderman Kyle Booksh made a motion to dispense with the reading and approve the minutes from the August 11, 2016 regular meeting. The motion was seconded by Alderman Marcus Hill and passed 3 - 0.

**Finances:** Alderwoman Jeanie David made a motion to approve the financial statements of July 31, 2016 as presented. This motion was seconded by Alderman Kyle Booksh and passed 3 - 0.

**Mayor's Report:**

- Louisiana Auto will present a plan for the placement of a fence around the property behind the shop which is being used for storage by Wednesday, September 14, 2016.
- Forte & Tablada, engineering firm are in the process of acquiring phone quotes for the sewer project on Big Dee Drive.
- There have been no updates on the sidewalk project
- Sewer Baffle - We were awarded \$174,000 in SEDAP funding to replace the baffle in the sewer pond.
- The Officials of the Village of Grosse Tete monitored the community during the recent flood event in our state and found water holding at Babin Lane. We are

currently working to have a 24 inch bore made under Dewey Drive to place a culvert to help alleviate water during heavy rain events.

- The Sidney Road waterline project has been started. The new six (6) inch waterline will run south on Sidney Road and will cross Bayou Grosse Tete near the railroad track and loop into the water lines on Highway 77 to create a continuous flow of water throughout the community.

**Police Department** – No Report given.

**Fire Department** – Fire Chief Hughes reported that he was contacted by the State Fire Marshall to assist in the rescue of Flood Victims in the recent floods. He stated that his firemen rescued approximately 200 people in the two days that they were assisting.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 7:15 p.m.
